


OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO FULL TEXT ARTICLES

OXFORD REFERENCE ONLINE

1. Display a full text article or definition.

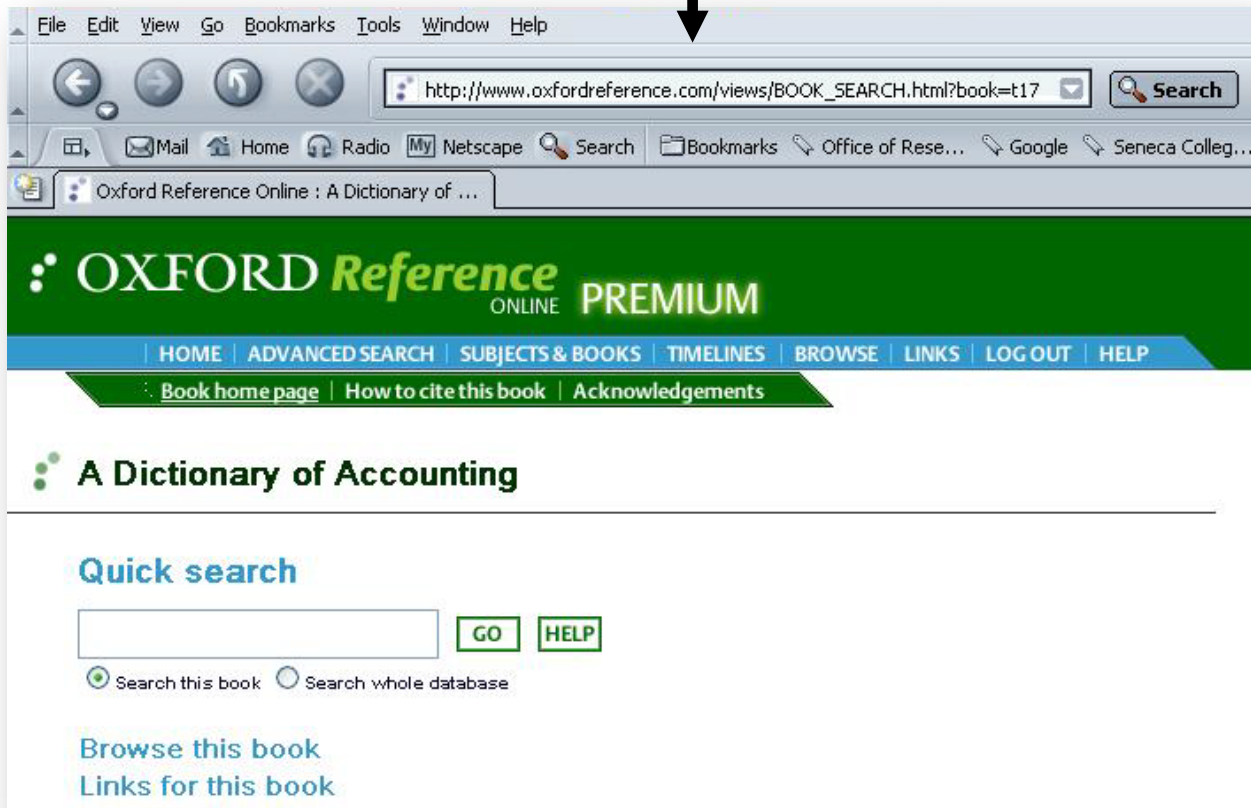

3. Add "<http://lcweb.senecac.on.ca:2048/login?url=>" to the front of the hyper link.
4. The example:
<http://lcweb.senecac.on.ca:2048/login?url=http://www.oxfordreference.com/views/ENTRY.html?subview=Main&entry=t56.e198> is a persistent link to the article above.
5. Test links prior to posting via email, course web pages etc.

OXFORD REFERENCE ONLINE

1. Go to a book's entry page.



2. Copy the URL from the web browser's URL address field.
3. Add "<http://lcweb.senecac.on.ca:2048/login?url=>" to the front of the hyper link.
4. The example:
http://lcweb.senecac.on.ca:2048/login?url=http://www.oxfordreference.com/views/BOOK_SEARCH.html?book=t17 is a persistent link to the book above.
5. Test links prior to posting via email, on course web pages, etc.
