

Your Guide to Study Spaces on King Campus

Finding a Good Study Space is almost as important as how you study. Finding your ideal spot to study depends on the type of studying you're doing. Here are some things to consider when looking for a study space:

Individual Study

- quiet space that allows you to concentrate on your task
- easy access to materials & resources you need
- few distractions that will take you away from studying
- a place where you can be comfortable (but not too comfortable!)

Group Study

- space where you can engage in discussion and debate without disturbing other students
- a large space that facilitates group work
- private-enough space that your study-group doesn't become a social drop-in

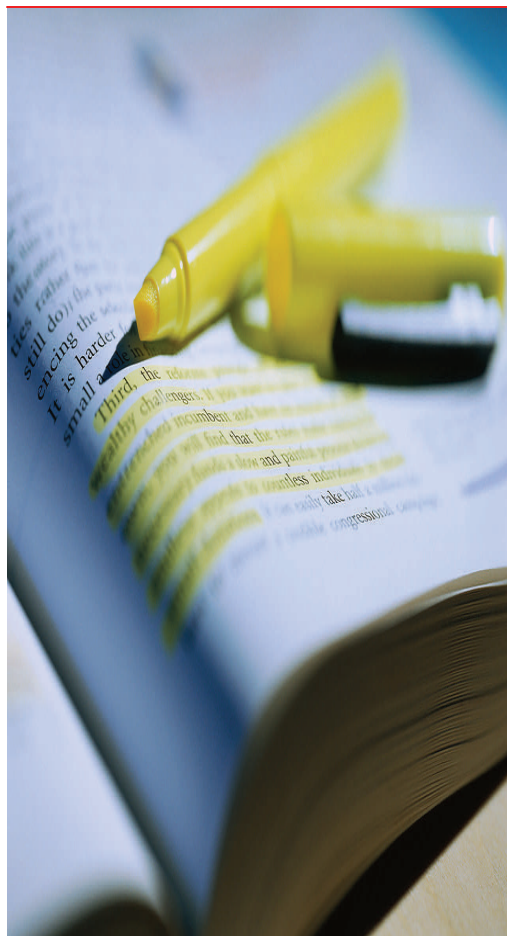

The **Library** has some great spaces, including study carrels, computer stations, study lounges, and four study rooms that you can book.

A little noisy when it's busy, the **Cafeteria or Pod A** is perhaps better suited for group study rather than individual study.

When the SSF isn't running an event, **Pod B or the Kingdome** is a good place to check out for some seating with tables or couches.

The **Connection Café** is an open study space with tables & chairs located outside the bookstore.

The **Learning Centre** has some space with tables.

Outside the **ICA Lab** are couches available for students to study.
