

## Your Guide to Study Spaces on Newnham Campus

**Finding a Good Study Space** is almost as important as how you study. Finding your ideal spot to study depends on the type of studying you're doing. Here are some things to consider when looking for a study space:

### Individual Study

- quiet space that allows you to concentrate on your task
- easy access to materials & resources you need
- few distractions that will take you away from studying
- a place where you can be comfortable (but not too comfortable!)

### Group Study

- space where you can engage in discussion and debate without disturbing other students
- a large space that facilitates group work
- private-enough space that your study-group doesn't become a social drop-in

### Study Spaces on Campus

The **Library** has some great spaces, including study carrels, computer stations, study lounges and study rooms you can book.

Try the **Business Atrium** (2<sup>nd</sup> floor of C building) as there are usually large tables and chairs there but note that it is used for special events on occasion.

There is a **Student Lounge** located on the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor B-building (outside the Bookstore) that might prove just right for you!

There is a **Study Hallway** located between rooms D3018 and D3060 that has some tables with chairs. Tucked away, this is a spot you might want to explore.

The **Technology Atrium** may have a few spots that will work for you—check out the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, A-building

**Study space** is located on the 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, C-building or the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, D-building

A little noisy when it's busy, the **Cafeteria** is perhaps better suited for group study rather than individual study.

The **Senecentre** is a good place to check out for some seating with tables, when there is not an event taking place.

Venture a little farther off the beaten path to the **Sports Centre** (G-building) where you will find benches overlooking the gym and some tables with booth-seating near the entrance.

If you live in **Residence**, there are several study lounges that you have access to for group or individual study.
