

## Your Guide to Study Spaces on S@Y Campus

**Finding a Good Study Space** is almost as important as how you study. Finding your ideal spot to study depends on the type of studying you're doing. Here are some things to consider when looking for a study space:

### **Individual Study**

- quiet space that allows you to concentrate on your task
- easy access to materials & resources you need
- few distractions that will take you away from studying
- a place where you can be comfortable (but not too comfortable!)

### **Group Study**

- space where you can engage in discussion and debate without disturbing other students
- a large space that facilitates group work
- private-enough space that your study-group doesn't become a social drop-in
