

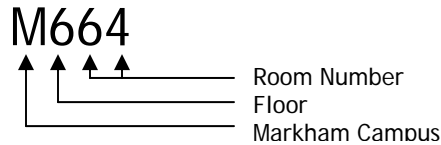
Reading your Timetable Markham, S@Y & Jane Campuses

First, you see the course code, which is the three letters followed by three numbers (ECE 157 CC).

The last one-to-three letters you see (A,BB,TLC) indicate which section you are in. Programs are often split into more than one section, to make sure class sizes are not too big. Below the course code is the location of where your room is, which may appear differently depending on what campus you are attending.

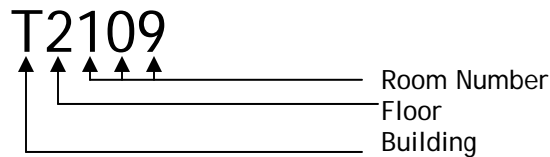
Markham Campus

You will see a letter followed by a three digit number. In this example (M664) we see the letter M. This indicates that your classroom is at the Markham campus. Following the letter is a number. The first of these numbers indicates which floor your room is located on. The last two numbers are the room number of your class. Markham has a ground floor as well which on your timetable will appear as (G40). This indicates that your classroom is on the ground floor of the Markham campus in room 40.



Seneca@York

You will see a letter followed by a four digit number. In this example (T2109) we see the letter T. This indicates that your Classroom is in the Tel Building. Following the letter is a number. The first of these numbers indicates the floor your room is located on. The last three numbers are the room number of your class. Your timetable will either show the rooms as (T2109) or (S2152) which means your classroom is in the Seneca Building with the numbers following indicating floor and room number.
