HOW DO I BECOME AN

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST?

1. Complete a four-year (Honours) undergraduate degree.

Seneca Program: Any Honours degree

- 2. Complete a Master's Degree in Occupational Therapy.
 - Complete a minimum of 1000 hours of supervised field-work experience or clinical practicum as part of the education program.
- 3. Receive licensure from the Canadian Association of Occupational Therapists (CAOT) and the College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario (COTO).
 - Pass the National Occupational Therapy Certification Exam (NOTCE)
 - Complete Suitability to Practice questions.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR MASTER'S DEGREE IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Requirements vary by institution. Common requirements:

- > Four-year (Honours) undergraduate degree.
- > GPA of 3.3 (B+ or 77%) or higher *Note: Minimum GPA requirements vary, and most applicants have GPAs that are significantly higher than the minimum.*
- > Reference letters / Confidential Assessment Forms.
- > Statement of Interest / Statement of Intent / Personal Essay.
- > Resume/ Curriculum Vitae (CV).
- > Admissions Interview.
- > Casper Test.

Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.

NOTES

> There is a maximum of three attempts for the National Occupational Therapy Certification Exam. After three failed attempts you are no longer eligible to write the exam.
